NC DIDI ANNOUNCES THE AVIATION, AEROSPACE and CYBERSECURITY UPGRADE OUTREACH SYMPOSIUM

Raleigh, NC – Monday, March 25th, 2019 - The North Carolina Defense Industry Diversification Initiative (NC DIDI) is excited to announce the launch of the Aviation, Aerospace and Cybersecurity UPGRADE Symposium on Wednesday April 17th, 2019. This year NC DIDI is poised to help North Carolina's aerospace and aviation defense contractors diversify into alternative markets. The initiative also seeks to ensure that the defense supply chain remains robust by aiding companies in better understanding the Department of Defense's newest cybersecurity regulations. NCDIDI is also expanding their growth and diversification project. The Universal Production Growth and Diversification Extension (UPGRADE) is a program of NC DIDI.

According to the latest numbers released by the US Department of Defense Office of Economic Adjustment North Carolina companies were awarded \$3.3 Million in contracts. Statewide defense contract awards fell from 2013 through 2015 but recovered quickly in 2017 reaching a total mirroring 2013, but are still below awards from 2010.

Secretary Larry D. Hall, of the North Carolina Department of Military and Veterans Affairs and Co-Chairman of NCDIDI stated, "We know have actionable insights from the data generated. These insights foster economic growth, job creation and innovation. NCDIDI is now positioned to make recommendations for a strategic plan. We also know that the majority of our defense companies are not cyber ready. We want to aid those companies in reaching DoD's newest cyber regulations so that these companies are compliant."

"We want North Carolina firms to be in a position to stay in the game." said Phil Mintz, Executive Director of North Carolina State University's Industry Expansion Solutions. "We are excited to be the state's repository for the supply chain data. This information will help the state better position companies to support our installations both here and abroad"

The event will be held at The NC RURAL CENTER in the SECU Conference Center located at 4021 Carya Drive in Raleigh, NC. The presentations will begin at 1:00pm and conclude at 3:30pm. The attendance of DoD contracting companies, economic development officers, government officials and procurement experts is requested. While the event is free, registration is highly recommended.
